Freestyle Libre®	AMBER 2	As per the <u>inclusion</u> <u>criteria</u>	For the specified patient groups only. To be initiated by a Consultant Endocrinologist. Review at 6 months in secondary care with prescribing only continuing where the patient meets the continuation criteria	
Glucodrate® rehydration sachets	GREY	High stoma output	Product has been discontinued

NHS England

NHS England have recently conducted several consultations which have resulted in the development of the following guidance. The APC will work alongside the CCGs to ensure the joint formulary is reflective of these recommendations.

- Conditions for which over the counter items should not routinely be prescribed in primary care
- <u>Items which should not routinely be prescribed in primary care:</u>
 <u>Guidance for CCGs</u>

Horizon Scanning, Formulary amendments and traffic light changes

- Flurbiprofen- an Amber 2 classification with a restriction to NUH ophthalmology consultant initiation for scleritis 2nd line to conventional NSAIDs
- Oxitriptan- Classified as Amber 2 for adults under the care of a tertiary metabolic centre and Red for paediatric patients as this service is delivered through NUH
- Betamethasone with clioquinol (previously Betnovate C®) Reclassified as Grey.
 Dermatologists had suggested Synalar C may be an appropriate alternative
- Bupropion for resistant/refractory depression classified as Red for use at Notts Healthcare Trust
- Otosporin® ear drops added as Green, second line after acetic acid
- Granulox® for chronic wounds added as Grey
- Atropine 1% eye drops reclassified as Grey. Minims may be used as an alternative.
 For patients unable to use minims due to limited dexterity ophthalmology suggest cyclopentolate 1%
- Bimatoprost 0.3% previously discontinued and patients switched onto 0.1%. A generic 0.3% is now available at a cheaper price, added as **Green**
- Algesal® reclassified as Grey following the NHSE guidance for CCGs which recommends that rubefacients should not be prescribed
- Fludrocortisone amended to include postural hypotension as an additional indication
