	Melatonin (Circadin®)	AMBER 2	Parkinson's Disease	RESTRICTED for patients with Parkinson's Disease AND rapid eye movement sleep behavioural disorders (RBD). Unlicensed but in line with NICE CG 71	
THE PARTY OF THE P	Eluxadoline (Truberzi ® ▼)	AMBER 2	Irritable bowel syndrome with diarrhoea	In line with NICE TA 471. First 4 weeks to be issued by secondary care with a review ahead of transfer to primary care.

Procollagen 3 testing

This test is part of the necessary ongoing monitoring which is specified within the dermatology shared care protocol for methotrexate and should be carried out <u>3 monthly in primary care</u>. This is specific to use of methotrexate in dermatology patients only.

Synonyms Clinical Indications Request Form Procollagen, PIIINP, P3NP Monitoring for hepatic fibrosis

Combined Pathology Blood form (Yellow/Black)

Patient Preparation None required.

PIIINP > 7µg/l in at least 3 samples over a 12 month period	Withhold until discussed with dermatology specialist team
PIIINP > 13μg/l in two consecutive samples	Withhold until discussed with dermatology specialist team

Horizon Scanning, Formulary amendments and traffic light changes

Formulary amendments

- Nutritional supplements; cost effective products added to the formulary in line with updated guidance. Dietician advice only. See formulary for full list.
- Famciclovir amended to Amber 2 for genital herpes, as per BASHH guidance
- Mefenamic acid reclassified as Grey, more cost effective options available.
- Sterimar nasal douche added as Grey. Patients should be advised to purchase OTC if required

Horizon scanning

- Inhixa®▼ Biosimilar enoxaparin preparation added as Amber 2
- Enoxaparin; information added to prescribe by brand due to the availability of a biosimilar. Prescribers should ensure that patients are maintained on the same brand where possible, but if a need to switch occurs (e.g. during supply problems) then appropriate patient counselling should take place as there are device differences.

- Freestyle Libre Classified as Grey while a submission is awaited
- Ferric Maltol formulary submission
- Prescribing for transgender patients—practice policy
- ADHD shared care for adults
